Non-motorized trail stewardship work on public lands is the OTG's primary mission. They

collaborate with the CMC by providing input on Colorado Parks and Wildlife grant applications by the USFS Ouray Ranger District and work with the CMC staff on testing and promoting the RIMS app to collect and report data on trail issues and other stewardship needs. Recently, the CMC provided the OTG a custom data dashboard so they can use RIMS data more efficiently to plan trail stewardship work with the Ouray Ranger District.
